Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The manager demonstrates a good understanding of how to safeguard children. For example, recruitment procedures help to ensure that staff are suitable to work with children. Risk assessment procedures ensure the premises and equipment used are fit for purpose.
- The manager understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to support children's well-being and individual needs. She knows the procedures to follow should she need to seek additional support for children.
- The manager demonstrates a strong understanding of how to provide a wide range of stimulating and interesting activities, indoors and outdoors, all year round, that reflect the individual interests of children.
- The manager understands the impact of using a range of effective and consistent strategies to promote behaviour management.
- The manager has addressed the recommendations raised at the last inspection. This demonstrates her commitment to enhance her provision and indicates a good capacity to improve her practice.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the manager and deputy manager how they intend to deliver the safeguarding and welfare requirements for children.
- The inspector talked with the manager and deputy manager about their knowledge of safeguarding and reviewed the evidence of the suitability of staff working in the club.
- The inspector looked at policies and documents the manager will use when caring for children and discussed how they reflect on their service.
- The inspector talked with the manager to gain an insight into their understanding of how they plan to provide indoor and outdoor activities.

SHARE registered in 2012 and is run by the committee of a registered charity. The out-of-school club employs 13 members of childcare staff. Of these, one member of staff holds an early years degree at level 6, two staff hold a qualification at level 4 and three members of staff hold a qualification at level 3. There are also regular volunteers who work with children. The club opens from Monday to Friday, during the school holidays and on Saturdays throughout the year. Sessions are from 10am to 3pm. The club also opens on Tuesday and Thursday during school term time from 3pm to 7pm.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
