## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision meets requirements

- The provider demonstrates a clear knowledge and understanding of her responsibilities to safeguard children. She knows what procedures to follow to protect a child's welfare.
- The provider recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to help provide consistency for children's learning and care.
- The provider understands the importance of promoting the health and safety of the children in her care. She has assessed and minimised the potential risks to children within the club. She talks about carrying out risk assessments to promote children's safety.
- The provider understands how to help children learn to respect one another and how to promote children's good behaviour.
- The environment is well maintained and well resourced. Children have the opportunity to access a range of resources.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector had a tour of the area used by the children and viewed the equipment and resources available.
- The inspector checked evidence of suitability of staff working at the club.
- The inspector looked at a selection of policies and records.
- The inspector spoke with the provider about the service she provides.

Kidzone registered in 2010 and is one of three settings run by Chestnut Grove Kindergarten Ltd. The out-of-school club employs three members of childcare staff. Of these, one holds an appropriate early years qualification at level 4 and one at level 3. The club operates from Monday to Friday, for 51 weeks of the year. Sessions are from 7.30am until 8.45am and 3pm until 6pm, during school term times. The holiday club operates from 8am until 6pm.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
