- The childminder understands her role in keeping children safe and protecting them from risk of harm. She is aware of the action to take should she ever have concerns about a child's well-being.
- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements. She knows how to observe and assess children's progress and how to identify any gaps in their progress.
- The childminder knows the importance of teaching children how to lead a healthy lifestyle, such as making healthy food choices and being physically active.
- The childminder acknowledges the importance of building strong partnerships with parents, including the value of sharing information about their children's learning and development.
- The childminder understands her role in teaching children how to behave well, and value and respect others.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
