Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to keep children safe and knows the safeguarding procedures to protect them. She is aware of possible signs and symptoms of abuse and neglect. All environments are risk assessed so that children can explore in safety.
- The childminder describes appropriate ways to observe and assess children's development. She explains how she intends to plan next steps to promote their learning.
- The childminder describes appropriate methods to support positive behaviour and foster children's self-esteem. She explains ways to promote healthy eating and daily exercise.
- The childminder understands the importance of partnership working. She understands how to establish links with external professionals and how to engage parents in their children's learning and development.
- The childminder describes how she intends to extend her professional development to help her to continually make improvements in her practice.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector spoke with the childminder about the educational programmes and discussed the range of toys, equipment and resources available for children in the early years age group.
- The inspector looked at and discussed a range of records, including policies and procedures with the childminder.
- The inspector checked documentary evidence of the childminder's suitability to work with children, including her qualifications.
- The inspector discussed how the childminder evaluates her service.
