## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision meets requirements

- The enthusiastic providers reflect on practice to ensure that children's formal learning at school is well supported through enjoyable activities. They demonstrate how they will use children's interests to engage them in play.
- The providers follow safe recruitment procedures. These are supported by an induction programme, regular meetings and ongoing training, such as safeguarding. Staff know what to do if they have any concerns about children's welfare. They understand how to keep children safe at all times.
- The providers show that they understand how to help children to feel a sense of belonging at the club. They describe how they help children to be kind and considerate to each other. They understand how to involve them in determining acceptable behaviour and rules.
- The providers and staff recognise and understand the importance of working in partnership with parents and children's teachers.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector observed activities and the interactions between the staff and school-aged children.
- The inspector went on a walk to collect children from school. She spoke to the providers, staff and children at appropriate times.
- The inspector carried out a joint observation with the manager and discussed the activities provided.
- The inspector held a meeting with the providers. She looked at relevant documentation and evidence of the suitability of staff working in the club.
- The inspector spoke to parents and took account of their views.

The Hub Kids Club opened in 2017. It operates a breakfast club from 7.30am to 8.45am and an after-school club from 3.15pm to 6.30pm, Monday to Friday, during school term times. The holiday club operates from 7.30am to 6.30pm, Monday to Friday, in all school holidays. The setting employs five members of staff. Of these, three staff members have appropriate qualifications at level 3 or above.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
