# **Summary of key findings for parents**

#### This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has not maintained valid public liability insurance as required.
- The childminder describes how she plans activities and routines to support children's learning and help them make progress. She understands how to assess children's development and help prepare them for starting school.
- The childminder knows how to work in partnership with parents and other providers when children attend more than one setting. She describes how she shares her ideas for children's individual learning with parents to help them to support their children's development at home.
- The childminder understands her responsibilities in protecting children from harm and neglect. She is aware of the signs and symptoms of possible concerns about children's welfare and the reporting procedures she must follow.
- The childminder explains how she helps children behave well and value each other.
- The childminder recognises the importance of keeping up to date with changes and evaluating her practice.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
