Summary of key findings for parents

This provision does not meet requirements

- Leaders do not ensure that staff have a relevant first-aid qualifications, as required.
- The deputy manager knows how to recognise and report possible signs that indicate a child may be at risk of harm. She and staff understand the importance of supervising children to help maintain their well-being.
- Staff understand how to provide a range of interesting, age-appropriate experiences for children to help support the skills they develop at school.
- Staff know how to support children's good health and physical well-being. They understand how to encourage children to behave positively.
- Staff recognise the importance of working with parents and other professionals, such as the school, to help support children's individual needs.
- The deputy manager recognises the importance of evaluating the setting's practices. She understands the importance of monitoring and developing staff's skills to help improve the club's quality.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

Rise Park Out of School Club registered in 2006. It operates from Rise Park Infant School, in the London Borough of Havering. The setting operates Monday to Friday, term time only. It provides a breakfast club from 7.30am until 8.50am and an after-school club from 3.10pm until 6pm. The provider employs 12 members of staff, four of whom hold an appropriate early years qualification at level 3.
