Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder shows a good understanding of child protection. She knows her responsibility in keeping children safe from harm and describes the action that she would take should she be concerned about a child's welfare.
- The childminder demonstrates a good knowledge of how children learn. She describes how she plans to use information from her observations and monitoring of children's development to plan for their next steps in learning to ensure they make good progress.
- The childminder knows how to support children's independence and help to build their confidence. She is aware of how to implement positive behaviour management strategies and how to help children to be considerate and respectful of others.
- The childminder understands the importance of helping children to develop healthy lifestyles. She plans to provide children with opportunities to be active.
- The childminder has a good understanding of the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals. She intends to seek the views of parents and children to help her identify future improvements to her service.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder and took into consideration the suitability checks.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to monitor children's development, plan their learning and work in partnership with parents.

- The inspector looked at the space available for childminding and discussed the resources she intends to provide.
