This provision meets requirements

- The manager has a sound knowledge and understanding of how to promote children's safety and welfare. For example, she ensures that risk assessments of the premises are carried out.
- The manager understands how to promote children's well-being. She shows an awareness of how to help children to manage their behaviour and to make choices in their play.
- The manager has a good knowledge of child protection procedures and understands her responsibility to protect the welfare of the children in her care.
- The manager shows a good understanding of working in partnership with the host school that the children attend. She knows how to gather information about what children are learning in the school and to complement this through a range of activities in the club.
- The manager demonstrates a good knowledge and understanding of how to work in partnership with parents. She demonstrates through discussion how she gathers information about children's medical and dietary requirements to help staff meet children's individual needs.
- The manager understands the importance of providing age-appropriate equipment and resources that promote children's interests.
- The manager demonstrates a good understanding of how to support staff in their roles. For example, she supports them through supervision, appraisal and staff meetings, and professional development opportunities.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the premises and viewed all areas that are used when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the manager and registered individual how they intend to support children's play and learning.
- The inspector looked at documentation the manager will use when caring for children.
- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability of the staff and spoke with the manager and registered individual about their self-evaluation of the club.
