- The childminder understands the benefits of working closely with parents and any professionals involved in children's lives to provide continuity of care and learning.
- The childminder keeps up to date with current childcare issues to maintain her knowledge and understanding. For example, she attends training and accesses appropriate literature on the internet.
- The childminder is aware of how to keep children safe. She understands her responsibilities to protect children and has a good knowledge of all aspects of safeguarding. The childminder understands the procedures to follow should she have any concerns about a child's welfare and holds a paediatric first-aid training certificate.
- The childminder has a good understanding of the learning and development requirements. She knows how to plan challenging activities and play experiences for children that promote their individual next steps in learning, support their development and help prepare them for their future learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
