# Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision meets requirements

- Partnerships with parents are well established. The provider ensures that excellent communication provides parents with detailed information about their children's progress and how best to support their learning at home.
- Safeguarding is effective. The provider has robust systems in place to ensure that all staff understand their role in child protection and the local procedures to follow in the event they have concerns about a child's welfare.
- The provider has excellent policies and procedures in place which help to ensure the smooth running of the setting. She provides staff with regular, high-quality training opportunities and focused supervisions to support them to continually develop their practice. Detailed evaluations of practice are used to identify strengths of the setting and specific areas for improvement.
- Children with special educational needs and/or disabilities are very well supported. The provider works closely with a range of external agencies to meet the needs of all children and uses specialist advice to continually improve the practice of all staff.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
