## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has addressed the actions raised at her last inspection. She has obtained an appropriate first-aid qualification.
- The childminder is confident in discussing safeguarding procedures. She can recognise the signs and symptoms of possible abuse and knows what to do should she have concerns regarding a child's welfare.
- The childminder recognises the need for strong partnerships with parents and other professionals to help children achieve and progress.
- The childminder knows how to carry out ongoing assessments to support children's development and to plan activities to help them progress. She demonstrates a secure knowledge of children's development.
- The childminder demonstrates that she understands how to positively manage children's behaviour. She knows how to help children build relationships, encouraging them to consider the needs of others and to share and take turns.
- The childminder is well motivated and continues to enhance her professional development to further improve her knowledge and skills.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about the learning and development and the safeguarding and welfare requirements of the early years foundation stage.
- The inspector checked a range of documentation, including the suitability checks of adults living and working on the premises, training certificates and policies.
- The inspector viewed the childminder's home and the areas to which children would have access.
- The inspector and the childminder discussed and looked at toys, books, resources and equipment that she intends to use.
