## Summary of key findings for parents

#### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure understanding of the learning and development requirements. She is aware of how to observe and assess children's learning effectively in order to plan for their future development and progress.
- The childminder demonstrates a very clear understanding of how to keep children safe from harm. She is astute to the signs and symptoms of abuse and has clear procedures for reporting any concerns. The childminder is clear on local procedures for child protection referrals.
- The childminder demonstrates, through discussion, that she understands the importance of working together in partnership with parents to meet the individual needs of children.
- The childminder has clear plans in place which show how she intends to work in partnership with schools to support children's transitions and ensure they are ready for the next stages in their learning.
- The childminder shows a clear commitment to improving her practice and providing high-quality care and learning. She has attended training sessions to keep her knowledge up to date and relevant.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
