## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not hold a current paediatric first-aid certificate.
- The childminder has recently completed child protection training. She has a secure understanding of the possible signs of abuse and she knows how to refer any concerns she may have to the relevant authorities.
- The childminder is enthusiastic about working with parents, to help to provide a consistent approach to children's learning and development.
- The childminder understands the importance of forming secure attachments with children to help to promote their well-being. She is aware of how to implement positive behaviour strategies.
- The childminder understands how children learn. The childminder knows how to observe, assess and monitor children's development and plan for their next stage of learning, including school.
- The childminder explains how she plans to seek the views of parents and children and use this information to help her to identify future improvements to her service.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## What the setting needs to do to improve further

### To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and Childcare Register the provider must:
