### This provision meets requirements

- The premises are safe and secure. The provider understands the need to keep children safe and healthy and to manage their behaviour appropriately.
- The provider understands her duty to safeguard children and protect them from harm. She ensures staff are aware of the procedures to follow if concerns are raised about a child to help keep them safe.
- The provider has robust vetting systems in place to ensure that staff are suitable to work with children.
- Staff understand the importance of working in partnership with parents and schools to promote continuity of care and support children's well-being.
- Staff recognise ways in which they can work closely with children to ensure they provide activities and experiences which are age appropriate and maintain children's interests.
- The provider is aware of the importance of evaluating practice to drive improvement in the quality of the provision for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
