Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- Leaders ensure that staff access regular safeguarding training. They know what actions to take if they have concerns about a child or the behaviour of another adult. Staff have suitable risk assessments in place to ensure children's safety, including at pick up times and when going on outings, such as to theme parks or to the cinema.
- Staff provide a wide and varied range of age-appropriate activities that is based on children's interests and individual needs. Staff understand the importance of working in partnership with parents and others to provide consistency in learning.
- Staff understand how to support children's positive behaviour. They have procedures in place to promote healthy lifestyles and children's health, including any medical needs. Children are assigned a key person to ensure their individual needs are met.
- Leaders monitor the provision effectively. They act on the views of parents, children and staff to evaluate and continuously improve the service.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the premises and viewed the areas used by the children.
- The inspector viewed documentation, including evidence of staff suitability, public liability insurance, paediatric first-aid qualifications and information about complaints.
- The inspector held a meeting with representatives from the school and the manager.
- The inspector spoke to staff and older children as there were no early years children present at the inspection.

Leighton Park Holiday Activity Scheme registered in 2000. The holiday activity scheme opens five days a week during school holidays from 7.30am to 5.30pm. The holiday activity scheme employs 14 staff and of these the manager holds an appropriate early years qualification. The majority of staff have specialist sports qualifications and/or experience in a sports-based vocation. One member of staff is trained in British Sign Language.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.
