# Summary of key findings for parents

#### This provision meets requirements

- The provider understands how to plan a variety of activities to support children's development and learning in all areas of the curriculum. She intends to provide resources that will stimulate children's imagination and creativity.
- The provider places a strong focus on supporting children's well-being. She intends to introduce mindfulness sessions to help children to relax after a long day at school. She wants to engage children in cooking and food preparation activities to promote their good health.
- The provider intends to ensure that children from different schools and age groups play and learn together in harmony. She says that she will teach children to respect each other and to understand and learn about each other's cultures, traditions and beliefs.
- The provider is fully aware of her responsibilities to safeguard the children in her care. She knows who to contact if she has any concerns about children's well-being or safety. She keeps in touch with her local authority and local provider networks to keep her knowledge up to date.
- The provider understands how to keep children safe. She assesses risks in her environment and on outings so that children can play and learn in safety.
- The provider knows how to use observations of children to assess their learning needs and abilities to help them make progress. She knows how to identify any gaps in their learning and how to plan for the next stages in their development.
- The provider understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and school teachers to promote continuity in children's learning. She has a clear vision for the development of her club and knows to obtain the views of parents and children to help her to make continuous improvements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
