Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder is familiar with child protection issues and the procedures to report any concerns, including allegations, to the relevant authorities.
- The childminder knows how to form close relationships with parents and how to encourage their involvement in children's learning.
- The childminder recognises the importance of self-evaluation to help improve the provision. She knows how to maintain her professional development to enhance her knowledge and skills.
- The childminder understands how to support children to develop their personal and social skills. For example, she describes opportunities to help children develop their independence and learn how to share with other children.
- The childminder knows how to observe and assess children's learning. She understands how to use this information to identify their interests and what they need to do next, in order to help them make good progress.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to provide activities and experiences that support children's learning.
- The inspector looked at the childminder's policies and documents that she intends to use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her processes for self-evaluation and her improvement plan.
- The inspector viewed resources and had a tour of the areas of the childminder's home that she intends to use for children.
