### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder keeps up to date with early years foundation stage requirements and changes to legislation. For example, she attends courses and undertakes regular online safeguarding training.
- The childminder knows how to assess children's skills and levels of development. She is aware of how to use assessment information to plan and provide challenging activities that help children to make progress in their learning.
- The childminder is aware of how to keep children safe and protects them from harm. She knows what action to take should she ever have concerns about a child's welfare or well-being.
- The childminder understands the importance of teaching healthy lifestyles to children, establishing good hygiene routines and effectively managing their behaviour.
- The childminder knows how to build effective partnerships with parents and other settings that the children attend. She appreciates the importance of sharing information with them about children's learning.
- The childminder knows how to evaluate her provision, and identify and action areas for further improvement.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
