This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not effectively implement her safeguarding policy. She does not ensure that she records all safeguarding information to help her identify and monitor any concerns about a child's welfare.
- The childminder understands how to use the information from her observations and assessments to plan for children's care and learning.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working with parents and other settings children attend. She knows the need to share regular information to help provide a consistent approach in meeting children's development needs.
- The childminder knows how to provide a wide range of activities to aid children's literacy skills.
- The childminder understands the benefits of providing children with daily opportunities to be physically active and healthy food to help support their physical health.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
