Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The provider demonstrates a clear understanding of her responsibilities to safeguard children. She knows what procedures to follow to protect a child's welfare. Staff's knowledge of child protection is up to date. They know what to do should they have any concerns about a child's welfare or safety.
- The provider follows safe recruitment procedures. She knows how to use supervision meetings to help to ensure staff's ongoing suitability. Staff have the opportunity to attend further training to help raise their skills and support children's experiences.
- The provider understands the importance of promoting the health and safety of the children in her care. She has assessed and minimised the potential risks to children within the club. She talks about carrying out risk assessments to promote children's safety.
- Staff demonstrate an understanding of how to promote children's good behaviour. They know how to support children to understand what is expected of them and how to follow the club's rules.
- The provider recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to help provide consistency for children's learning and care.
- Staff know how to support children's learning and development. They provide a welcome and inviting environment with a variety of exciting and engaging resources.
- The provider demonstrates that she is aware that self-evaluation contributes towards improving experiences for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the areas that the children use.
- The inspector viewed documentation, such as staff's qualifications and evidence of their suitability to work with children.
- The inspector held discussions with the provider, who is also the manager, regarding her roles and responsibilities for safeguarding children.

Sky Out of School Club registered in 2012. The club employs six members of childcare staff, five of whom hold appropriate early years qualifications at level 3. The manager holds a level 6 qualification. The club opens from 7.30am to 8.55am and 3.15pm to 5.30pm, Monday to Friday, during term time only. A holiday club also operates during school holidays from 8am to 5.30pm, Monday to Friday.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.
