This provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a clear understanding of how to safeguard children. She regularly updates her knowledge about child protection matters. The childminder knows the appropriate reporting procedures to follow in the event of any child protection concerns.
- The childminder knows how to help keep children safe and secure. She knows how to risk assess her premises, outings and the activities that children undertake to minimise any hazards.
- The childminder understands the importance of working well with parents and other professionals involved in children's care to help support continuity for children.
- The childminder knows how to make learning fun and build on the interests of children. She knows how to assess and plan for individual children's learning to help them achieve their next steps.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's physical and emotional well-being. She knows how to hep children behave well and make relationships.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her childcare practice.
- The inspector had a tour of the childminder's home to view areas intended for childminding purposes, and checked the suitability of toys and resources available.
- The inspector sampled a range of relevant documentation, including the childminder's training certificates, policies and information records.

The childminder registered in 2002. She lives in Canonbury in the London Borough of Islington. The childminder operates from Monday to Friday, from 8am until 6pm, all year round, except for bank holidays and family holidays. The childminder holds a relevant early years qualification at level 3.
