This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibilities to safeguard children. She is aware of the possible signs and other indicators that a child may be at risk of harm. She holds details of relevant agencies to share her concerns.
- The childminder demonstrates an appropriate awareness of children's development and know how to plan effectively, observe children's play and assess their learning.
- The childminder has taken positive steps to address previous recommendations. She now has a better understanding of how to support children in their learning further and build on partnerships with other settings that children may attend.
- The childminder understands the value of partnerships with parents from the outset to support continuity of children's care and learning.
- The childminder continues to develop her knowledge further and completes safeguarding training and some training about children's learning and development.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector discussed required children's records to be maintained and looked at a range of policies and procedures shared with parents.
