This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not have a secure knowledge of wider aspects of safeguarding including, the 'Prevent' duty.
- The childminder is aware of how to keep children safe. For example, she completes risk assessments and has an up-to-date paediatric first-aid certificate.
- The childminder understands the importance of working with parents. For example, she knows the benefits of gathering information about children's starting points in learning. She knows how to make regular assessments of children's progress and use the information to plan a range of exciting activities.
- The childminder values diversity and describes the importance of teaching children to respect others.
- The childminder describes how she reflects on her practice and makes changes to benefit children.
- The childminder knows how to promote positive behaviour and support children to develop their well-being.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
