Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has up-to-date knowledge of safeguarding and child protection issues. For example, she is aware of signs of possible abuse and neglect, and the local reporting procedures to follow if she has a concern.
- The childminder knows how to meet the early years foundation stage requirements. She understands how to promote and evaluate children's learning to help them make good progress from when they first start.
- The childminder understands the importance of promoting children's healthy lifestyles and good hygiene practices, such as through daily routines and by providing opportunities for children to engage in regular physical activities.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to support the learning and care needs of individual children.
- The childminder demonstrates how she plans to promote children's positive behaviour, including how she intends to encourage them to respect one another, and value the diversity of children's backgrounds and home experiences.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector checked areas of the childminder's home that are used when caring for children.
- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability of the childminder and adults living on the premises. She discussed the childminder's understanding of self-evaluation.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the childminder and viewed documentation that she will use when caring for children.
- The inspector talked to the childminder about how she will keep children safe and protect them from potential harm.
