## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to recognise the possible signs and indicators of abuse. She knows what to do should she have any concerns about a child's welfare. She completes training to ensure her knowledge of safeguarding issues is up to date.
- The childminder demonstrates a suitable knowledge of the learning and development requirements. She knows how to observe and assess children's progress and plan for their next steps in learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of building strong partnerships with parents and other providers children attend to promote consistency in children's care and learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of teaching children good hygiene routines and the benefits of healthy lifestyles.
- The childminder demonstrates a commitment to improve her service. She reviews her practice and completes training to develop her skills and knowledge.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

### Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the childminder and viewed documentation that she will use when caring for children.
- The inspector toured the areas of the premises used by children and discussed the equipment and toys available.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder and took account of the suitability checks.

The childminder registered in 2003 and lives in Chatteris. She operates before and after school during school term time only. Sessions are from 7.30am to 8.45am and from 3.15pm to 4.15pm, Monday to Friday.
