# Summary of key findings for parents

#### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibility for safeguarding children. She knows the signs to look for that may lead her to have concerns about a child's welfare. She is aware of the procedures to follow to inform the relevant agencies.
- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements. She knows how to plan appropriate activities and how to assess children's ongoing progress. This includes the undertaking of required assessments.
- The childminder demonstrates an understanding about how to keep the premises secure and safe to support children's welfare. For example, she has had new steps put into place from the home into the garden to help children access the garden area safely and independently.
- The childminder understands about encouraging positive behaviour in children. She knows how to promote good health and well-being.
- The childminder maintains her professional development through training. She has taken appropriate action to meet previous recommendations to improve learning outcomes for children.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

#### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder to assess her knowledge and understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to promote children's learning and development.
- The inspector discussed the professional development of the childminder, this included steps taken to meet previous inspection recommendations.
- The inspector looked at documentation relating to training completed by the childminder, written policies and procedures, and discussed relevant records the childminder plans to use when caring for early years children.
- The inspector looked at areas of the home that the children have access to.
