# Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibility to safeguard children. She is aware of the possible signs of abuse and knows the procedures to follow if she has concerns about the welfare of a child.
- The childminder is committed to her professional development. She demonstrates how she regularly uses information to update her policies, procedures and teaching practices.
- The childminder knows how to assess and track children's development and plan next steps in their learning to challenge children to make further progress.
- The childminder understands the importance of encouraging children to learn about healthy lifestyles. For example, she talks about how they use her garden and local parks for physical play.
- The childminder understands the importance of effective partnerships with parents and with other settings children attend. She knows this helps to provide a consistent approach to children's learning and development.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
