- The childminder describes how she will promote children's learning and development. She knows how to support and motivate children through a range of play experiences, based on their interests.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to observe, track and assess the progress children make. She describes how she will work with parents to promote continuity of children's care and early education.
- The childminder knows how to manage children's behaviour and how to help children become confident and emotionally secure in her care.
- The childminder describes how she intends to extend her professional development and how this will help her to make continual improvements to her practice.
- The childminder has a confident knowledge on how she can safeguard children. She knows how to notice if a child's welfare is at risk and is aware of procedures to follow if a concern arises.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
