Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to evaluate her provision. She appreciates how updating her skills will help improve the quality of her teaching and promote good outcomes for children.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's learning, how to monitor, assess and plan suitable activities for their individual needs. She knows how to support children to make progress and prepare them for school. The childminder knows how to encourage children to behave well and value each other's differences.
- The childminder is aware of her responsibility to keep children safe from harm. She knows what to do if she has any safeguarding concerns about a child's welfare and the reporting procedures to follow.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working closely with parents and other professionals. She knows that working in partnership supports continuity in children's care, learning and development.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the premises and viewed the resources and areas used for childcare.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her understanding of the safety and welfare requirements. The inspector looked at relevant documentation and checked evidence of the childminder's suitability and qualifications.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she would deliver the educational programmes and how she would undertake observations, planning and assessment when caring for children.
- The inspector viewed and discussed the range and suitability of the equipment and toys available for children.
- The inspector discussed how the childminder would self-evaluate her provision.
