This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has not maintained a paediatric first-aid qualification.
- The childminder displays a secure understanding of the ways in which children learn. She explains how she intends to observe and assess children's progress in order to plan activities that interest children and support their ongoing progress.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents. She discusses how she intends to share information on children's achievements, to support their development and progress.
- The childminder has a sound understanding of her role and responsibility to protect children from harm. She demonstrates a good knowledge of what would cause her concern about a child's welfare and the procedures to follow to report any concerns that she might have. The family home is safe and welcoming.
- The childminder understands the importance of being a good role model to children. She discusses how she plans to teach them to value and respect others. She recognises how to promote children's behaviour in a positive way.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's well-being and maintain their good health. She describes how she will provide opportunities for outdoor physical play and teach children to use good hygiene routines.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
