## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands current child protection issues. She knows the correct procedures to follow should she have a concern for a child's safety and well-being.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of sharing information with parents about their children's progress. She has a range of toys and resources, and knows how to plan activities to meet children's different learning needs.
- The childminder understands the importance of helping children to learn how to stay safe and keep healthy. For example, she has systems to practise a fire drill and provide children with opportunities to exercise and eat regular home-cooked meals.
- The childminder understands how to encourage children's positive behaviour. For instance, she knows to teach children to have respect for others.
- The childminder understands how to continually evaluate her practice. She reviews her childcare qualifications and maintains essential training, such as paediatric first aid and safeguarding.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder, and took into consideration the suitability checks of adults.
- The inspector looked at policies and documents that the childminder intends to use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder, her understanding of the educational programmes, including the assessment for children aged two.
- The inspector viewed areas that are available for use when caring for children, both inside and outdoors.
- The inspector checked evidence of the childminder's qualifications and the suitability of toys and resources for children.
