This provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to assess children's progress and how to provide a range of interesting activities and resources to help children make further progress. She understands how to prepare children for their future learning and gain skills for an eventual move onto school.
- The childminder understands the benefits of sharing information with parents to help provide a consistent approach to children's development and continuity of care.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to safeguard children. She is aware of what steps to take and who to contact, should she have a concern about a child, to protect their welfare.
- The childminder knows how to support children's emotional well-being and learning needs. For example, she understands that children benefit from feeling safe and secure in her home.
- The childminder understands the importance of updating her own professional knowledge and skills, and evaluating practice to help develop her service.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector spoke with the childminder about her understanding of safeguarding, child protection and safety.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her understanding of, and how to deliver the requirements of the early years foundation stage.
- The inspector sampled documentation of planning and assessment, policies and procedures, risk assessments and the childminder's qualifications.
- The inspector viewed the parts of the childminder's home that she plans to use when caring for children.
