This provision meets requirements

- The childminder plans to use information from observations of children's play to assess their progress and plan for the next steps in their learning.
- The childminder understands the educational programmes and provides a wide range of resources, toys and equipment to help to promote all areas of learning.
- The childminder knows the referral procedures to follow should she have concerns about the safety or welfare of a child.
- The childminder understands the importance of working closely with parents, other early years providers and external professionals to help to promote consistency and continuity of care and learning for children.
- The childminder is committed to providing an inclusive service. She has procedures in place to monitor children's progress, so that she can quickly identify any gaps in children's learning and seek external intervention, if necessary.
- The childminder intends to help children to build positive relationships with others, make choices and be independent in readiness for school.
- The childminder plans to evaluate her teaching, the environment and activities to help to continuously improve the quality of her practice.
- The childminder intends to talk to children about the house rules and use positive praise and encouragement to teach children how to behave appropriately.
- The childminder plans to implement safeguarding policies and procedures and carry out daily risk assessments to ensure children's safety and welfare.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector carried out a tour of the premises and the outdoor environment.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning. She also discussed with the childminder how she intends to support children's play and learning.
- The inspector looked at relevant policies, procedures and documents that the childminder will use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her knowledge and understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector checked evidence of the qualifications and suitability of the childminder. She also discussed her self-evaluation and improvement plans.

The childminder registered in 2011 and lives in Rochdale. She operates all year round from 7am to 7pm from Monday to Friday, with the exception of family holidays. The childminder holds an appropriate early years qualification at level 2.
