## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how children learn. She knows how to make assessments and plan for children to help them make progress and prepare them for the next stages in their learning, such as school.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working closely with parents and keeping them informed about children's welfare and learning.
- The childminder knows how to safeguard children and has recently completed child protection training. She knows how to promote children's safety and welfare.
- The childminder understands the importance of reflecting on her practice and keeping her knowledge and skills up to date, including through regular training and research.
- The childminder is aware of how to promote children's health, for example, by providing daily exercise and nutritious food.
- The childminder understands how to encourage children to behave well, and value and respect each other's differences to help them learn about good manners and diversity.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector reviewed the resources and talked to the childminder about how she intends to deliver the educational programmes when caring for young children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her knowledge of safeguarding, risk assessment and self-evaluation.
- The inspector looked at a range of documents. This included evidence of the suitability of all adults living and working on the premises.
- The inspector took account of parents' views through written questionnaires.
