This provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to work in partnership with parents to build up a picture of what children already know and can do when they first start. She describes how she intends to plan activities based on children's interests, next steps and stage of development.
- The childminder understands the importance of supporting children to develop healthy lifestyles. She understands her role in helping children to build strong relationships. She knows to teach them to share, take turns and to respect each other.
- The childminder is committed to continuing her professional development and knows how to use training to improve her personal effectiveness.
- The childminder recognises the need to evaluate her service.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's good health and care needs.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The childminder registered in 2012 and lives in a village on the outskirts of Goole in East Yorkshire. She operates all year round from 3.30pm to 6pm, Monday to Friday, except for bank holidays and family holidays.
