Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her duty to keep children safe. She knows the signs that indicate a child may be at risk of harm and what to do if she is concerned.
- The childminder recognises the importance of self-evaluation. She knows how to seek the views of others to help her reflect on her setting. She understands the importance of developing her skills and knowledge to help improve children's experiences.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals, to help provide consistency in children's care and experiences.
- The childminder understands how to provide a range of interesting, age-appropriate activities to support children's involvement and to help build on the skills they gain at school.
- The childminder knows how to support children's physical well-being, such as through healthy eating and regular exercise. She understands how to support children's welfare, such as through regular risk assessment. She knows how to supervise children in her care to keep them safe and how to encourage them to behave well.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector spoke with the childminder about how she evaluates and improves her service.
- The inspector viewed the premises.
- The inspector viewed a sample of documentation which the childminder intends to use, such as her policies and procedures.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder to assess her understanding of the statutory requirements.

The childminder registered in 2014 and lives in Rainham, in the London Borough of Havering. She provides out-of-school care only from 7.30am to 8.45am and from 3.10pm to 5.30pm, Monday to Friday. She also operates during the school holidays from 7.30am to 5.30pm. The childminder holds an appropriate early years qualification at level 2.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.
