Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to prepare children for school. She intends to help them in a variety of ways, such as by helping them to be more independent and manage small tasks on their own.
- The childminder keeps her safeguarding knowledge current. She recognises the importance of developing her skills and keeping up to date with new guidelines and requirements. For example, she has attended training to help her to provide a healthy diet for young children.
- The childminder understands how children learn and intends to plan activities to keep them motivated and interested in learning.
- The childminder knows how to teach children about keeping safe and to be aware of their own personal risk and safety. For example, she plans to teach them how to risk assess the different slides in the local park and access them safely.
- The childminder recognises the importance of evaluating her practice to help her identify areas for improvement. She knows how to seek the views of parents and children to help her do this.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
