Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder explains how she plans to work closely with parents from the very beginning. She explains how she intends to gather and share regular information on an ongoing basis. She understands the importance of working in close partnership to help to provide a consistent approach to children's care and learning.
- The childminder understands how children learn. She knows how to make assessments and plan for children to help them make progress and prepare them for school.
- The childminder shows a secure understanding of her responsibility to safeguard children. She knows how to identify the indicators of abuse and the correct procedures to follow if she has any concerns about a child's welfare. Furthermore, she is aware of the importance of risk assessments and of providing a safe environment for children.
- The childminder seeks appropriate training opportunities to develop her knowledge and teaching skills. She knows how to evaluate her practice to make improvements.
- The childminder understands about encouraging positive behaviour in children. She knows how to promote good health and well-being.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
