## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to use assessments to identify learning priorities for children. She knows how to plan and tailor activities around children's abilities and interests to support them in making continuous progress.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of the importance of working in partnership with parents and any other professionals involved with children to help ensure children receive consistent support between their different settings.
- The childminder has up-to-date knowledge and understanding of child protection matters and the procedures to follow if she is concerned about a child's welfare.
- The childminder understands the importance of physical and outdoor play, and of teaching children how to keep themselves healthy and safe.
- The childminder recognises the value of using self-evaluation to help improve her practice.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector spoke to the childminder about how she intends to support children's learning and development, and meet the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector looked at relevant documentation, including that relating to safeguarding practices and the childminder's suitability to work with children.
- The inspector checked the suitability of the premises, furniture and equipment, and assessed the childminder's understanding of providing appropriate resources for children's different stages of development.
