

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 6 June 2018, we conducted an inspection where we judged the provision to be not met. As a result, we issued a welfare requirement notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within in the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed:

supply the relevant information to Ofsted about changes to people aged 16 and over who live on the premises, in order for Ofsted to carry out the necessary suitability checks, by 06/07/2018

gain a suitable knowledge and understanding of the procedures to follow to report any safeguarding concerns, by 06/07/2018

provide assistants with suitable supervision, support and coaching to ensure their suitability to fulfil their role, by 06/07/2018

ensure that all documentation is available for inspection, including evidence of the assistant's first-aid qualification, by 06/07/2018

maintain an accurate daily record of children's attendance, by 06/07/2018.

Following the inspection, we conducted an announced visit on 9 July 2018. We found that the provider had taken sufficient steps to the meet the legal requirements.

On 5 July 2018, we received a concern in relation to risk assessment. We spoke to the childminder about this information. We found that they had failed to notify Ofsted of a significant event. On this occasion we do not intend to take any further action. The childminder has since reviewed the procedures for checking arrangements for collecting children from school. This includes any last minute changes from parents. The childminder will be able to give you more information about this.

The childminder remains registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
