This provision meets requirements

- The childminder recognises the importance of developing her skills and keeping up to date with new guidelines and requirements. For example, she has updated her safeguarding knowledge to include new information to keep children safe.
- The childminder knows how to help children prepare for school. She plans to support them to develop independence.
- The childminder understands how to reflect regularly on her practice and plans to seek the views of children and parents to help improve the quality of her practice and develop her setting further.
- The childminder plans to teach children to value and develop an understanding of their own and other people's similarities and differences. For example, she intends to teach children about a variety of festivals and about diversity and different cultures in a positive way.
- The childminder understands how to plan a range of activities and provide resources to cover the different areas of learning.
- Since the last inspection, the childminder has a better understanding of how to further develop children's understanding of healthy practices in relation to their personal hygiene.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector reviewed the resources and talked to the childminder about how she would plan activities to support children's learning.
