## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has not maintained a full paediatric first-aid qualification, which is a requirement of her registration.
- The childminder has a good understanding of why working in partnership with parents, other providers and agencies is important. She discusses how she will share information to promote continuity of approach.
- The childminder has a good understanding of safeguarding and wider child protection issues. She has undertaken appropriate training to underpin her knowledge and is aware of the correct local reporting procedures to follow, should she have a concern about a child's welfare.
- The childminder discusses how she will help children understand the importance of hygiene, healthy eating, physical exercise and keeping themselves safe. The childminder has a good awareness of how to identify and minimise risks in her setting.
- The childminder demonstrates a commitment to professional development. Since her previous inspection, she has achieved an early years degree. The childminder discusses how she will use self-evaluation to develop the quality of her practice.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's emotional well-being. She discusses how she will get to know children from the very start, celebrate their individual backgrounds, cultures and needs. The childminder also understands the importance of preparing children for their move on to school.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## What the setting needs to do to improve further

### To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and Childcare Register the provider must:
