Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder is clear about her responsibilities to safeguard and protect children in her care. She is familiar with child protection and wider safeguarding issues, and she know the procedures to report any concerns, including allegations, to the relevant authorities.
- The childminder recognises the importance of providing parents with her policies and procedures for them to know what to expect from her services. She understands the benefits of working with parents to help extend children's learning at home.
- The childminder understands how to evaluate her practice and identify areas for further improvement. She knows how to access opportunities to maintain her professional development and to keep her skills current.
- The childminder knows how to observe, assess and plan children's learning to ensure that they make good progress, in comparison to their starting points.
- The childminder has a good understanding of the different ways to support children's personal development and their physical well-being. In addition, she recognises the importance of working with parents to promote and support children's positive behaviour.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
