This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a strong understanding of the early years foundation stage. She comprehends how children learn and recognises the importance of tracking children's development to ensure that they have opportunities to make good progress.
- The childminder recognises how to promote children's health. For example, she knows the benefits of children having daily opportunities for fresh air and exercise.
- The childminder understands her roles and responsibilities to protect children. She is confident in the signs and indicators of a child being at risk and knows the referral procedures for safeguarding if needed.
- The childminder comprehends the importance of working in partnerships with parents and other professionals involved in children's learning, to promote continuity in care.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of keeping her training and skills up to date.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
