## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder is aware of her responsibility to maintain children's welfare. She understands how to address any safeguarding concerns and the need to report these to the appropriate agencies.
- The childminder understands learning and development requirements. She understands how observations and assessments can be used to plan appropriate experiences to meet children's individual development.
- The childminder understands the value of working in close partnership with parents, other settings children may attend and other professionals, to complement children's care and development.
- The childminder understands how to keep children safe in her home and promote healthy lifestyles. She knows the importance of providing food and drinks that meet children's individual dietary requirements.
- The childminder is currently extending her professional development, such as working to gain a level 5 childcare qualification. She has met the previous recommendations to improve parental engagement and improve children's learning outcomes further.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder to assess her understanding of the requirements of the early years foundation stage.
- The inspector looked at a range of relevant records and viewed the areas of the home used for childminding.
