Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to plan, observe and assess children's learning experiences to help them progress and develop further.
- The childminder has recently updated her safeguarding knowledge and understands her responsibility in protecting children to help keep them safe.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents, other professionals and settings that children attend, to provide continuity for children.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's well-being. She provides children with a choice of healthy snacks and daily fresh air and exercise.
- The childminder knows how to help children to manage and learn about their own feelings and behaviour. She understands how to explain boundaries and expectations.
- The childminder has an appropriate range of toys and equipment that are readily available for children to select independently.
- The childminder works closely with the local authority to reflect on her provision. This helps her to ensure her skills, knowledge and procedures are up to date.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector checked registration and insurance documents, and the childminder's paediatric first-aid qualification.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her knowledge of the requirements of the early years foundation stage.
- The inspector sampled a range of documents, including planning and assessments, and discussed the childminder's policies and procedures with her.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's process for self-evaluation and areas identified for improving practice.
- The inspector viewed all areas in the property used for childminding.
