## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements. She knows how to monitor children's progress and demonstrates how she plans activities that reflects their interests and next steps in learning.
- The childminder demonstrates an understanding of child protection issues. She understands how to recognise concerns and to record and report these where appropriate.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other early years settings children attend, to help support children's care and learning.
- The childminder knows how to manage children's behaviour positively. She explains how she helps them to acquire social skills and to develop their confidence.
- The childminder explains how she provides children with an inclusive environment. She explains the importance of developing children's self-awareness and how to help them to recognise and value similarities and differences.
- The childminder understands the importance of reflecting on her practice to help her make improvements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
