Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibilities to safeguard children's welfare. She knows how to respond to any signs that a child might be at risk of harm, and the procedures to follow to protect them. The childminder has maintained her knowledge of how to administer first aid through attending regular training.
- The childminder fully understands about the benefits of exercise and physical activities. She discusses how she intends to support children's learning about healthy eating through growing vegetables in her garden and allotment.
- The childminder demonstrates an understanding of the importance of partnerships with parents and other professionals to promote a consistent approach to meeting children's individual needs. She knows how to support children to develop their independence and understands how this helps them to be ready for school.
- The childminder understands the benefits of keeping her own skills up to date and evaluating her provision in order to continue to make further improvements. She also meets up with other childminders to share good practice and maintain the high quality of her provision.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
