## Summary of key findings for parents

#### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a confident knowledge of child protection. She understands the signs that may indicate a child's welfare is at risk and knows what to do if she has concerns.
- The childminder understands how to use observations and assessments to plan for children's progress. She demonstrates, through discussion, how she provides appropriate learning opportunities to support children's next steps in learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of working with parents. She demonstrates how she implements effective methods to share information about their child's progress, to help ensure children's individual needs are met.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's health and well-being. She explains that she provides children with balanced meals and daily opportunities for fresh air and exercise.
- The childminder demonstrates how she supports children's safety and welfare. She explains how risk assessments are carried out and demonstrates how she keeps the premises secure.
- The childminder recognises the need to evaluate her provision. She actively develops her professional knowledge and skills to help her make improvements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
